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• Students will be able to use unfamiliar stories of the individuals involved as examples of strength and determination to try to affirm their rights, some successfully, others unsuccessfully.

• Students will recognize that history is not static and that information and knowledge needs to be reassessed over time and from different perspectives.

ESSENTIAL	 What rights were being denied to Chinese and Asian Americans that they felt compelled to challenge? How did the laws that treated Chinese and other Asians differently come about?
QUESTIONS:	 What were the consequences of each of these decisions in the long term? How does each of these cases symbolize an aspect or aspects of being American? What is the relevance of these cases today?



INTRODUCTION:


